To Our Customers,

As everyone knows the drought has no end in sight. We are urging our customers to conserve water as much as possible. As the conditions continue, we have no doubt we will have to issue restrictions.

We hope to avoid problems at our water plants that we have seen this past week happen to other water companies. Some systems have had problems due to equipment being over worked from high water demand and long pumping hours.

LWSC has three wells that pump water to our two water towers. The towers hold a combined 300,000 gallons of water. To serve our customers efficiently, have adequate water and pressure all three wells must be in service and pumping. At this moment we are pumping between 300,000 to 350,000 gallons a day. Our wells are running 6-8 hours a day to keep up with the current demand.

If our demand increases to 450,000 to 500,000 gallons a day, or the pumps & motors run 12-14 hours a day it could cause the well pumps and motors to overheat and damage them. Should pumpage increase and a well go out of service LWSC could not supply adequate water and pressure to our customers until a repair could be made. When pumps, motors, and wire must be replaced it is at an extreme cost. Please conserve so we do not face the cost of higher bills due to repairs from over pumping.

LWSC is asking ALL customers to be water cautious and to conserve water by limiting outdoor watering. We understand that people have crops and livestock and by no means are we suggesting you stop watering them but again just be cautious of how much watering you are doing and the times of day that you are doing it.
